

Readers are introduced to different characters who have autism, how autism may affect their actions, and how we can be good friends to people who have autism.






A IS FOR AUTISM BY DANI HAENDIGES


ALL CATS ARE ON THE AUTISM SPECTRUM BY KATHY HOOPMANN
