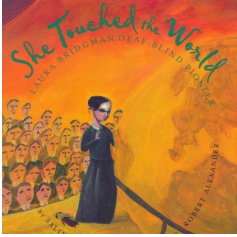

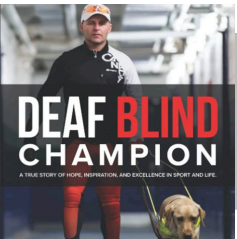
**SHE TOUCHED THE WORLD: LAURA BRIDGMAN, DEAF-BLIND PIONEER

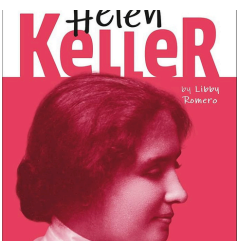

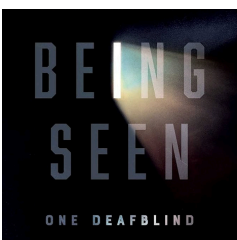
