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Emotional Disabilities Education Specialist

Responsibilities:

- Provide itinerant outreach services to students who experience emotional disabilities across Alaska.
- Provides consultative services to school districts and their staff, students, and parents.
- Observe students in educational settings for the purpose of providing modeling evidence-based interventions and strategies for the development of functional and educational outcomes.
- Compiles data from a variety of sources (e.g., IEP meetings, student observations, special education teachers, school psychologists, etc.) for the purpose of customizing training and support.
- Provides special education instructional support and training, including evidence-based topical in-services and workshops to school personnel, parents, students, peers, and the community.
- Assist districts in procuring/adapting specialized instructional materials.
- Perform other agency and/or program duties as assigned.
- Facilitate interagency collaboration.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Master's degree in special education with an emphasis on learners with emotional disabilities/school psychologist OR a Bachelor's degree in education and suitable experience.
- Recent experience with learners who experience emotional disabilities and their families.
- Experience in teaching social interaction and play skills.
- Knowledge of current research and range of educational practices in the field of emotional disabilities.
- Current knowledge of relevant assistive technology commonly used with students experiencing emotional disabilities.
- Ability to travel independently in rural/remote Alaska throughout the school year.
- The requirements for an Alaska State Department of Education Special Education Type A Certificate or a Special Services Type C Certificate have been met.
